Reminders about Dogs and Other Domestic Animals

The warm weather finally seems to have made its way upon us. There may be more time now to take that walk with your dog or other pet as you may have a less hectic schedule in the summer or perhaps your children who are out of school now are walking the pets. Please be courteous and keep your pet on a leash and remember to pick up after them, make sure you take a plastic bag or other suitable means with you when you go out to use to pick up the animal excrement. The Oswego Police Department would like to remind residents about our Ordinance regarding dogs and other domestic animals. Here are a few sections from the Ordinance to keep in mind while out walking your pet.

Domestic animal is defined as an animal or fowl of any type maintained as a household pet or guardian and includes, but is not limited to, dogs, cats and other types of animals or fowl normally maintained as a household pet....

Section 6-4-1: Definitions

No domestic animal shall be on any public area within the village unless restrained by a leash...no longer than six feet (6'). Upon the approach of another pedestrian you are required to bring your pet in close enough to allow one half of that public way to be available for use by the other pedestrian. **Section 6-4-2: RUNNING AT LARGE**

All animal excrement deposited outside the owner's property shall immediately be removed and disposed of properly by the individual in custody of the animal.

Section 6-4-8: ANIMAL EXCREMENT
